



Since 2017, all DWIH have been coordinated by the DAAD.



Capes-Humboldt Research Fellowship Programme

for Postdoctoral and Experienced Researchers (up to 12 years after doctorate)

Georg Forster Research Award (by nomination)

for internationally eminent academics (at the height of their careers)

International Climate Protection Fellowships

- for prospective leaders from transition and developing countries who are engaged in climate protection (up to 12 years after first university degree)
- with background in non-governmental organisations, public administrations, politics, academia or business

German Chancellor Fellowships

- for prospective leaders from Brazil, China, India, the Russian Federation and the USA (up to 12 years after first university degree)
- from a broad range of areas such as politics and public policy, law, media, business, the nongovernmental sector, and the arts





Capes-Humboldt Research Fellowship Programme

- excellence-based selection, sponsorship of people, not projects
- 2 calls per year
- free choice of academic host/collaborative partner in Germany
- assessment by independent expert reviewers
- decision by an independent selection committee
- 140 Capes-Humboldt Research Fellowships granted so far

How does the DFG support international cooperation?

Stage of cooperation	Funding of	Funding duration
Excellent cooperation with a group of foreign partners for several years	Initiation of international cooperation: preparatory and cooperative visits, bilateral events such as workshops, etc.	up to 12 months
	Bilateral collaborative projects: Personnel, instrumentation, consumables, travel budget, guest scientists, budget for publication on the German side for up to 3 years (renewable)	up to 3 years (renewable)
	Coordinated projects e.g. International Research Training Groups: international joint research, training and supervision program for PhD students	until 9 years (2 x 4.5 years after evaluation)

BAYLAT-Call for Proposals for New Scientific Projects (BAYLAT-Anschubfinanzierung)





- Aim: creating new and long-lasting scientific cooperation between Bavarian and Latin American partner institutions
- Eligibility:
 - collaborative projects of investigation
 - design of joint study programs
 - collaborative projects aiming at the improvement of lectureship
- Yearly call for proposals under https://anschub.oasys.baylat.org/page/xhtml/index.xhtml
- Funding of up to 6,000€ per proposal
 - Also includes: travel costs to Bavaria and accommodation for Latin American partners
- Open for all disciplines and themes and 20 countries in Latin America

FAPESP/BAYLAT-Workshop






- Aim: increase and expansion of cooperation in science and research between the partner regions Bavaria and the State of São Paulo including funding of junior researchers
- Eligibility:
 - Scientific workshops, mobility of scientists, information exchange
- Yearly call for proposals
- Workshops take place in Bavaria and in the State of São Paulo
- Funding depends on workshop's conception
- Open for all disciplines and themes and researchers from the two regions
- Next call: first half of 2019 for funding years 2020/21



Collective Research Networking

- A CORNET project consortium consists of three pillars in each participating country/region:
 - 1. <u>SME organisation</u>, association or cluster (depending on national structures),
 - 2. research performer and
 - 3. SME user committee with a <u>minimum of 5</u> SMEs per country/region (the required number might be higher or lower depending on national rules).
- The CORNET approach is <u>bottom up</u>, inviting SME associations or groups from <u>all industrial sectors</u> dealing with any technology to submit proposals. The only requirement is that the project idea needs to <u>follow the rules of pre-competitive</u> Collective Research.
- CORNET provides support in <u>finding</u> <u>partners</u> for your project idea.
